#### How it teaches 'Community'

- Who do the superhero characters help?
- Why do they want to help others?
- Who are the real superheroes in our community?

#### How it teaches 'Identity'

- Who is my favourite superhero and why?
- What do I believe to be right or wrong?
- How can I make good choices?
- How can I be an everyday superhero?

#### How it teaches 'Connections'

- How can I help others in my family, school and community?
- How do I treat others when I am happy or when I am sad?

Create an Andy Warhol comic book style cover

Design and make a superhero car

#### Literacy links

- Adventure stories—looking at heroes and villains
- Onomatopoeic language
- Reading comics and action stories like Traction Man

- One more, one less, finding numbers between.
- Tens and ones— explain how and why a number is greater or lesser than another.
